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Finally, we are still in the business of actively communicating through email. Each of our principals transmits a regular newsletter with things of interest from their schools-- menus and calendars being the most popular items! Every Monday, I send a Weekly Message from the Superintendent that can be a celebration of students or staff, an announcement of health or safety information, or simply a reinforcement of what our principals or schools send. Our Mass Notifications blast email system is used regularly for emergency or time-sensitive messages. Of course, we still mail out each edition of *Value Education*.

An important part of any school district's service to its residents lies in its physical accessibility. Rye Neck's Board of Education far exceeds the minimum required when it comes to hosting public meetings. Our Board holds two public meetings per month: one regular meeting and one a working session. The regular meetings are televised through LMC Media, but all are open to in-person public presence.

With the return of safe gathering in-person, we have restarted our practice of holding meeting presentations during the school year. These are a means of sharing specific information with our community. The Board kicked off the year with a new presentation on the requirements, structure, and role of the Board of Education itself. We followed with academic presentations on test data, elementary reading, and HS science in our new Collaborative Science Center. That series will continue with a presentation on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in January. Our presentations in the late winter and spring will focus on sharing budget information. Each is an excellent opportunity to learn a little bit more about how our schools, with community support, can maintain a steady course of improvement for the benefit of our students.

Thank you to our Rye Neck community who once again made the PTSA Ribbon Fundraiser a great success! It was incredible to see all the families and local businesses support the PTSA. We raised over \$38,000 and all funds raised go directly to support PTSA programming.

Speaking of programming, because of your support, we have already had several amazing programs this year. One of the highlights was when Tony Hoffman spoke with Middle and High School students about his journey from addiction and homelessness to the Rio Olympics.

Your support also helped bring in multiple STEAM programs for our students including the “Path to Rhythm” assembly for 3rd graders, where they learned about the rhythms of Brazil, as well as a presentation about extreme weather from ABC News Meteorologist (and Rye Neck Parent) Rob Marciano for 8th, 9th, and 10th graders.



Other programs included a presentation from a Holocaust survivor for our 9th and 11th-grade students and a virtual planetarium presentation from The National Air and Space Museum for our 6th graders. Finally, another Rye Neck parent, Dr. Jason Carmel, spoke to high school students about “Brain Function: What Injuries Teach Us.”

We also had outstanding health and wellness programs at the elementary schools. We continued the 4th Grade Circus tradition. Students learned circus skills, including stilt walking, juggling, and plate spinning during a week of lessons, culminating with a Friday night performance for families. The Rye Y Recess Program has also been in full swing since September. This program provides a Rye YMCA instructor at recess each day to lead games and activities.

The Environmental Committees at the elementary schools also organized many events. These included a walk, bike, and scoot to school week, the candy drive (where students donated Halloween candy to our troops), and the Coat Drive.

We also held many social events to bring the community together. The Rye Neck International Committee hosted a potluck dinner. The Middle School Spooktacular provided a fun night of food, dancing, and other activities for the 200 students in attendance. Finally, thank you to those parents and community members who supported the PTSA at Casino Royale in November.

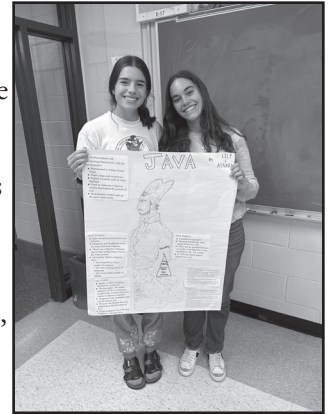
